KENYATTA NATIONAL HOSPITAL

The inaugural Foundation project in 2015 was undertaken in partnership with the Kenyatta National Hospital (KNH), the biggest referral hospital in East & Central Africa. We sought to improve service delivery for the over 500 patients received daily as well as enhance the work environment for over 100 staff at the Accident & Emergency wing.

The renovation project aimed at improving:

- 1. Access to services by restructuring flow of patients through reconstruction of service points
- Patients' navigation through clear labelling
- 3. User experience through renovation of facilities including information desk, floor & lavatories
- 4. Working environment for staff thus improved service delivery



To further support our students and enhance our interaction with them, a mentorship programme was rolled out for staff to impart leadership skills to them.



Brian Maingi, Starehe Boys' Centre Alumnus

I was born in the coastal parts of Kenya in 1997. During this time, inter-clan wars flared up separating me from my family at the age of six months leaving me an orphan. I am told that I was found one morning in the streets of Likoni and taken to the nearby children home called 'Nebas Children's Home'.

I started school in the children's home which had provision for education up to standard three. However, while in class 3, my dream to attain an education came under threat when the home experienced a financial downturn. Resources at the home became so limited that even providing for basic needs for the children was a great challenge. Due to this, I stayed out of school for some time; but my dreams did not die. I was always hopeful.

I left the children home with the hope of reuniting with my family, a family whose whereabouts were not forthcoming and I subsequently ended up living on the streets. I just hope finding my family will be a success one day. I however found a new family of friends on the street and this made the days bearable.

One day, a friend from my street family mentioned the availability of sponsorship for needy students at St Kevin Hill boarding school; a private primary school. Since I still had the academic dream alive in me, I walked to the school and I told them "I want to learn". Fortunately I was admitted to the school. I am forever grateful to the Director of the School for listening to me and admitting me.

I exceled in the Kenya Certificate of Primary Education (KCPE) with 418 marks. This earned me a precious opportunity at Starehe Boys' Centre and School. This is where my relationship with Old Mutual begun. Old Mutual offered me a full scholarship through Starehe Boys.

I graduated from Starehe in 2015 with a mean grade of A- and have been admitted to Maseno University to pursue BSc. Mathematics and Computer Science. My greatest endeavour has been to be part of the solution to many problems that face our society today. I strongly believe that my career path will give me that privilege."

CONSERVATION OF NDAKAINI DAM

For the last 10 years, our staff in collaboration with the Ndakaini community and other corporate sponsors have planted over 100,000 seedlings of indigenous trees around Ndakaini Dam. This conservation exercise is funded from proceeds of the Ndakaini Half Marathon held annually in September. Our persistent efforts have not only restored the tree cover but also nurtured athletic talent nationally. The initiative has enhanced the local economy at Ndakaini with local purchase of seedlings and contracting of labour for the preparation and maintenance of the trees.









REHABILITATION OF ABERDARE NATIONAL PARK

In a similar environmental initiative, we have partnered with the Kenya Wildlife Services for the rehabilitation of the Aberdare National Park. Our staff joined hands with the Kenya Wildlife Services to plant a record 40,000 seedlings in the Aberdare National Park in December 2016 and June 2017.

STAFF VOLUNTEERISM - MALCOLM MUSILA PROJECT

Meet Malcolm Musila from the UAP Old Mutual IT Department. Malcom is also a volunteer at an honest intention organization. Through the community builder project, he has enabled the dreams of Hoywik's School Community.

Malcolm's project entails setting up a Sewing Workshop to create employment for jobless parents in the school. Hoywik is an acronym derived from the founding organisation's name, Humanity of Youth Widowers Initiative.

The school was founded in 2006 by Zachary Ngare, the current Executive Director. Having grown up in a disadvantaged home, Zachary resolved to make a difference by supporting families affected by HIV/AIDS through provision of affordable education and a feeding programme for the children.

Starting the centre with only 3 children did not deter Zachary from dreaming. The school has now grown to 169 children from Kibera community spreading across class 1 to Form 3. Some of the challenges facing the school include; unreliable income from school fees due to poverty levels resulting in high default cases, high teacher's turnover from poor salaries and high absenteeism due to domestic problems in most families

Malcolm's colleagues visited the school to provide inspirational talks on career choices and entrepreneurship to create mind shift.

STAFF CARE & SHARE PROGRAMME

Our people contribute their time, personal resources and skills for community development projects by participating in: clean up activities, mentorship programmes, providing care to patients and donation of food. In 2016, UAP Old Mutual Foundation held the first ever open day for non-profit partners. This engagement created a platform for staff

to support the community through purchase of merchandise from the partners ranging from; wrist bands, t-shirts, skirts and environmentally friendly waste bags. This drive benefitted over 1000 people in Kenya, Tanzania, Rwanda and Uganda.

There were **192 volunteerism opportunities** created and **1000 staff** have been engaged in staff engagement programmes since the inception of the Foundation.

ELECTRONIC WASTE COLLECTION

In addition to tree planting initiatives, UAP Old Mutual Foundation rolled out a collaboration with Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment (WEEE) Centre, a programme by Computer for Schools, to provide awareness on responsible e-waste management amongst staff. The Foundation mobilised collection of electronic waste across the Kenya business for recycling at WEEE centre. This is anticipated to be an annual project as part of the environmental management piece in Responsible Business manifesto.
